(c) (4 Marks) $\sum_{n=2}^{\infty} (-1)^{n+1} \frac{(n+1)3^n}{2^{2n+1}}$

(2) (6 Marks) Evaluate the following series if it is convergent otherwise show it is divergent.

$$\sum_{n=1}^{\infty} \left(\frac{2(3)^{n+1}}{5^{2n}} + \frac{3}{2^n} \right)$$
